From the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

Our Year 6 leaders finally set off on their long-awaited excursion to Canberra on Wednesday morning. The children are very excited to be able to head off to the colder weather in the ACT after the disappointment of last year's cancelled overnight excursions.

This three-day excursion provides wonderful educational highlights including a Parliament House tour, Questacon, the Australian War Memorial and the Institute of Sport to name a few. It is also a special opportunity for the students to spend time with one another away from school creating life-long memories with their classmates in their final year of primary school. On behalf of the parents, I add my thanks to the staff (Cheryl Taylor, Hannah Fryar, Kylie Lloyd-Jones & Isabella Gane), who are giving up time away from families to attend the excursion.

New Appointment for Fr. Shaju

As many of you already know, at a recent meeting of all priests of Fr. Joy and Fr. Shaju's order, Fr. Shaju was elected as the Vicar General of the Society of the Oblates of the Sacred Heart [OSH]. As a result, Fr. Shaju will only return to our parish and school for a few short weeks before he takes up his new position in India.

I am sure the entire community will wish Fr. Shaju all the very best in his new position. The school will look to find a time to suitably farewell Fr. Shaju and thank him for his commitment and dedication to supporting the faith of our school and parish community.

Australian Government Capital Grants Program (CGP) for Non-government Schools

As you know, at Catholic Schools Broken Bay we are committed to ensuring we develop and maintain the best possible spaces and facilities to support learning. We have recently been updating long term plans to help guide the next phase on investment and have been working with the Commonwealth Block Grant Authority to determine if our proposals might be eligible for grant funding.

I am delighted to advise that St. Patrick's Asquith is the successful recipient of a significant government grant to support our capital works program.

The delegate for the Minister for Education under the Australian Education Act 2013 has approved an Australian Government Capital Grant of \$950,013 to assist our school with the refurbishment of existing outdated, disconnected and undersized learning spaces. Construction of a veranda extension and installation of a lift. Relocation of staff amenities, sick bay and refurbishment of some administration areas, refurbishment of existing library for multi learning spaces.

The Australian Government's contribution to this project under the CGP is allocated through the New South Wales Catholic Block Grant Authority (CBGA). We look forward to finalising the planning and construction of these works as we continue to implement improvements to student learning.

Covid-19 Update

Our school is expecting a new supply of RAT kits to send home to families (one box per student) to assist with the current NSW Health requirements_regarding close contacts. Further information will be provided when the RAT kits are sent home.

In the meantime, I encourage parents to stay vigilant for any symptoms of the virus during this time and remind parents to make sure they follow the Covid-safe guidelines:
If a student or staff member receives a positive RAT test, they need to o record the positive RAT result through the <u>Service NSW website</u> or <u>Service NSW app</u> o <u>notify the school of the positive RAT or PCR test result as soon as possible</u> o follow <u>NSW Health advice</u> to isolate for 7 days
