From the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

What a day it was! Today's annual primary school athletics carnival was a resounding success. The sun was shining, the cheers resonated throughout the day, and outstanding efforts by all students competing and supporting each other with great team and school spirit resulting in a real triumph for our school community.

From the 100-meter sprint and relay races to the field events and novelty events, the children gave their all and had a ball. A big shout-out to Mr Barlow and our dedicated parent volunteers and school staff who worked tirelessly behind the scenes. Their organisation, enthusiasm, and hard work made this day possible. A big congratulations to our colour house captains who did an outstanding job leading the carnival.

Building Project Update

Even though the Stage 3 children are enjoying being in their new classrooms there have been a few delays with fully completing these rooms. This week the final touches are being made to the Stage 3 classrooms with the installation of internal sliding doors between rooms along with the new track lighting. This will allow students and teachers to fully utilize the spaces as they have been designed.

As happens with building the timeline is often longer than we wish it to be. I have instructed the builders that I prefer that they take time to be thorough to attain a quality result. The completion of the Kindergarten classrooms and staffroom has been pushed back until 28th June. With the completion of this stage of the refurbishment, Years 3 & 4 will relocate from their classrooms with work beginning in Block C.

The completion date for the school office spaces has also been pushed back into next term.

This is a timely reminder for those parents who use Kiss and Drop of an afternoon. This service does not commence until approximately 3:15, when the buses have finished. The teachers are not able to bring your child out to you before Kiss and Drop commences, so if you arrive early you will need to park your car and walk up to the gate to collect your child. Unfortunately, we have had some parents challenge the teachers around this point. Please know that parents can be fined if they park in the Kiss and Drop area before the buses have finished collecting students.

Enrolment for 2025

If parents are aware of families that have children ready to start school next year, I encourage you to recommend our school and the offer to come and find out more information. Prospective parents can contact the school to have a private tour and pick up an enrolment pack from the school office or enquire online via a link on our website.

As communicated during the information session, the school initially requires up to 28 enrolments to create one class before a second class will be considered. Enrolments beyond that number will be placed on a waiting list until we have enough applications to make a second class.

We have already received application forms from families and enrolment interviews have already started. I strongly encourage you to complete your enrolment form and return it to the school office as soon as possible, as this will help secure your child's place for kindergarten next year. I also encourage parents to tell your friends who have children starting school to consider St. Patrick's, as that could boost enrolments and secure a second kindergarten class.



Here's a new puzzle to try this week!


The aim is for the whole family to collaborate on solving it. Encouraging the whole family to share puzzles and talk to each other mathematically is very important to us. Enjoy!
