From the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

Our building project is proceeding well with the relocation date for the completion of the new Kinder classrooms brought forward to Monday 24th June. This is exciting news for our community as it marks the halfway point of the refurbishment of all learning spaces. I am sure our Kindergarten students, parents and teachers will be thrilled to move into these new learning spaces and once again establish the usual routines.

This also means the start of the next stage of the project that will see our Years 3 and 4 classrooms rejuvenated. As a result, the Stage 2 classes will relocate to the new library spaces for the remainder of this term and for part of next term. Both Kindergarten and Stage 2 classes are beginning to pack resources in readiness for the move. Our challenge is to move spaces while still teaching. In response, the school has developed a relocation plan in consultation with the builders to minimise the disruption to learning while relocating rooms.

I am sure our parent community will be keen to see the results of the refurbishment. We will open the new Kindergarten classrooms for parents to view once the Kindergarten classes are established and settled in their new classrooms.

P&F Meeting

Our next scheduled P&F General Meeting is Wednesday 19 June at 7pm. The meeting will be held online (link to be provided) and in person at the school. At the meeting the school will provide an update on the Life Skills Go program and outlining some important changes to school reports. Following is some information about these themes that will be spoken about in more detail at the P&F Meeting.

Life Skills Go

The Life Skills Go Program is a school wide program that was purchased by the generous support of the P&F. The program provides opportunities for students to check in with their class teacher on their well-being and provide data and resources to educate and support student well-being.

PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS

Semester 1 Reports

The Semester 1 reports are being written and finalised over the coming weeks. There have been some changes to the format of the reports which coincide with new curriculums being taught in English and Mathematics as well as updated advice from the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA).

In response Catholic Schools Broken Bay have created standardised report formats for all CSBB schools and provided professional learning to all staff on how to apply gradings for each curriculum area.

Kindergarten Enrolments 2025

If parents are aware of families that have children ready to start school next year, I encourage you to recommend our school and the offer to come and find out more information. Prospective parents can contact the school to have a private tour and pick up an enrolment pack from the school office or enquire online via a link on our website.

Once our new Kindergarten classrooms are completed the school will hold two further open day sessions. We are inviting local preschool educators to come and see the new facilities, see the kindergarten classes in action and hold a Professional Learning session to strengthen the links between pre-kinder and kindergarten educators. We will also invite prospective parents to visit the classrooms and see the wonderful opportunities available at our school.

Additional Staff Development Days for 2024

Earlier this year, I communicated that the school would have additional staff development days in 2024. These days will primarily focus on Teacher Professional Learning in Curriculum which has been a strong emphasis of new NSW Curriculum for English and Mathematics that have been recently adopted in all NSW schools and developing and implementing the Catholic Schools Broken Bay Towards 2025 Strategy.

The next Staff Development Days for all schools in the Diocese of Broken Bay will be on the last day of Term 2 and the first day of Term 3. The dates for these staff development days are:

- Friday 5th July (the last day of Term 2)
- Monday 22nd July (the first day of Term 3)

I trust that strategically placing these days around holiday breaks is an advantage to our families.

St Vincent De Paul Winter Appeal




Baptism for Older Children










Premier Reading Challenge Well done to those who are READING and logging





What is abuse?

There are many types of abuse that can be experienced:



Financial abuse includes limiting access to a person's bank account, spending their money without permission, or abusing powers of attorney for financial gain.



Neglect includes not providing basic items such as food, clothing or a safe place to live, or preventing another person from receiving the medical or social support they need.



Psychological abuse

includes treating an adult like a child, stopping someone from making their own decisions, threatening or stopping someone from seeing their family and friends, or verbal abuse and bullying.



Sexual abuse includes sexual assault, inappropriate washing or handling of a person's body, enforcing nudity, or using sexually explicit language.



Physical abuse includes hitting, kicking or using another type of physical force to hurt, intimidate or control another person.

If you have concerns about your own wellbeing or of any older person in their family, home and community:
