# From the Principal

#### **Dear Parents and Carers,**

Welcome back! It's been wonderful to see all our students return to school this week with such a positive attitude. They have been excited to reconnect with friends and settle back into their routines. I am looking forward to making this term a great one together full of learning opportunities for the children but also chances for the school community to come together to support planned celebrations and events.

This term we will celebrate the religious Feast Days for Mary MacKillop and the Assumption Mary the Mother of Jesus, as well as a liturgy for Father's Day.

We look forward to our annual Book Parade and author visit next Monday. We are lucky to have two talented authors join us for our book week celebrations, Kate and Jol Temple who are well known for the Bin Chicken picture book series.

The children are already preparing for our annual School Public Speaking competition and we will hold the School Spelling Bee competition later in the term. Stage 2 and Stage 3 children are also fortunate to be participating in a soccer Gala Day in the coming weeks.

#### 100 Days of Kindergarten

The date for the 100 Days of Kindergarten Celebration has been changed once more to Wednesday, 7th August. This adjustment ensures that the Book Week Parade and the 100 Days of Kindergarten Celebration do not occur on back-to-back days. I am sure this change is welcomed by parents, so they have time to adequately prepare for both events.

#### **Open Day Session for Preschool Educator**

On Wednesday this week we hosted a very successful Open Classroom session that enabled local Preschool Educators to connect with our school. The educators were excited to reconnect with their former pre schoolers but also very impressed with our new Kinder Classrooms. During the morning, they observed the Kinder classrooms in action and participated in a Professional Learning discussion with myself and Mrs Schyvens. This session also helps establish positive channels of communication between the preschool and school settings that also support transition process.

The Preschool Educators have indicated that they will assist in promoting the school including the opportunity to attend the Open Day session, to take a tour and find out more about the school.

### PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS

#### **Enrolments- Open Classrooms**

We are inviting prospective parents to our Open Classrooms session next week on Wednesday 31st July at 9am to see the wonderful opportunities available at our school. I encourage parents who know of families in their neighbourhood who are looking to enrol their child at school to let them know about our Open Day session. We are still looking for further enrolments for Kinder 2025 to secure a second kinder class and have places available in other grades for older students.

#### **Pastoral Care Focus**

This fortnight we are focusing on the learning behaviour of 'We are respectful learners who learn and let others learn.' This is such an important value of our school as our core business is about students learning. Through this pastoral care focus we are seeking to set each student up to be successful learners by displaying the expected behaviours and making good decisions that benefit them and their classmates. I encourage parents to speak with their child/ren about this focus and demonstrate it at home when they are completing home tasks alongside their siblings.

#### **School Uniform**

I have also noticed some students not wearing the school tie which is part of the full School Winter Uniform. I encourage parents to check that their child/ren is/are correctly dressed in their full uniform every school day. I thank parents in advance for supporting the wearing of the school uniform.

#### **Building Update**

The builders have taken the opportunity of having an empty school site to push the building works along with carpet and lino being installed already in the new learning spaces for Year 3 and 4 classrooms in Block C. There has been new lighting installed in the library spaces.

Parents will have already seen the significant works carried out in the grass area in readiness for the new lift and playground. This work is expected to continue for all of Term 3.

While the School Office is on track, the sickbay has been delayed as we wait for the telecom company to assist with the final relocation of the office server to the library. This will delay the relocation of the school office as the sickbay and office need to function together.

We also had some roofing works completed on the hall during the break with the replacement of the skylights.

## **Ignite Festival**





Term 3 Weeks I-2
We are respectful learners who

#### Why is it important to develop this skill?

As we start back for Term 3... children sometimes need to remind ourselves of classroom expectations and routines for learning. The focus this fortnight is so students recognise their importance in contributing to the classroom learning environment, not only for themselves but in order to also help others learn.

We encourage children to utilise good learning behaviours in the classroom and routines at home to continue learning, whether it be through homework or everyday learning e.g. cooking, making, and creating. Working together with siblings or friends outside of school can help develop those problem-solving and relational skills with others.



Establish some good homework routines for independent learning.

Read at home with a parent each night or when possible.

Get older siblings to teach younger siblings new concepts.

How can you help develop this at home?

Tell your child something new about your life they might not know or teach them about a new concept they are interested in.

Develop time management skills to complete tasks around the house in accordance with other commitments.


## <u>Maths challenge</u>
