PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE

Dear Parents and Carers, Girls and Boys,

Last week the children celebrated at mass and learnt the great and significant works of Saint Mary MacKillop and the collective works of her order, the Sisters of St. Joseph, in communities across Australia.

This week, we joined the parish to celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of Mary with a mass. The feast of the Assumption celebrates Mary being assumed body and soul into heavenly glory. Mary was an ordinary person who was blessed by God, became the mother of Jesus and was always there for him.

On this day the church acknowledges God's faithfulness to Mary and the trust she had in God. Her love and devotion supported Jesus throughout his life and is an example for us all. Mary is the Queen of All Saints.

I acknowledge and thank our senior students for leading the celebration with readings, prayers and processions and our Kinder students for leading the thanksgiving hymn and movement. It was wonderful to witness our students leading our school and parishioners with such confidence and grace. The assessments will be undertaken during class time and could change due to staff availability. If students are away on any of these days, they will have until the end of that week to complete the assessment.


Canteen
