### **Building Update**

Our Year 3 and 4 classes have now relocated back to their newly refurbished classrooms and work has already begun on the Years 1 and 2 classrooms. As a result, the Year 1 and 2 classes have also relocated to the library spaces for the next stage of the build. If all goes well, all classrooms will be completed early next term.

We also expect that the school office should be completed in the next few weeks with a proposed date of 12th September. On Saturday the worksite was very busy with concrete being poured as part of the construction of the new lift being installed in Block C.

I acknowledge and thank our staff and children for their patience and resilience during each stage of the build. We have needed to relocate classrooms and resources many times as well as the staffroom and front office spaces.

The children have also been compressed into smaller playground spaces and even use the hall as an extra play space. I thank the teachers for being creative in providing different options for play activities during this time to keep the children interested and happy.

At this time of the term the children begin to get tired so I encourage parents to keep the usual routines where you can but also provide opportunities to rest and re-energise. The staff are working hard to remind children of the school expectations and providing plenty of positive feedback and encouragement when we see safe, respectable and responsible learners.

# PASTORAL CARE FOCUS Term 3 Weeks 7-8 We are safe learners who are at the right place, at the right time, doing the right task.

## Why is it important to develop this skill?

It has been a very busy term already with lots of exciting things already happening inside and outside of school. The last week has been particularly busy with movement of children to new and different spaces in our school with the next stage of the build. It is important for us to remind children of their responsibility to be safe learners in these spaces, by being in the right place, at the right time, doing the right task.

This includes using the spaces on the playground and in the classroom, in the right and safe way, following instructions and being where they need to be at particular times.

It is important to remind our older students to model this to our younger students as they look up to them for guidance.
