Swimming Carnival

Hornsby Shire Pool had scheduled next year's Annual School Swimming Carnival for the first day of Term 1. The scheduled timing is too difficult to adhere to and no other suitable dates were available in February for Hornsby Pool. Other pools were either not available or too costly to book.

As a result, we have needed to move the 2025 School Swimming Carnival to Week 9 Term 4 this year (Friday December 13th 2024). We will also hold the K-2 Water Fun Day on the same day. More information regarding this event will be provided next term.

Building Update

The completion of the school office including the sickbay and staff toilets has been pushed-back a week with a proposed handover on the 20th September. We will begin moving some items into the school office before this date, however I ask parents for their patience during the relocation of this space as it will take a few days for everything to be set up and back to normal functions.

The next stage of the classroom refurbishment is advancing well and the builders are expecting that the rooms will be completed by Week 2 of Term 4. This will allow the Years 1 and 2 classes to relocate out of the library to their new classrooms and for the temporary library space to finally move back upstairs to its original but newly refurbished space. We also expect the new furniture for these rooms to be delivered in the first weeks of Term 4.

The last stage of the refurbishment is the completion of the space between the School Hall and the lower Block C classrooms. This area will have new synthetic grass and a large shade cloth but is not expected to be finished until November.

St. Leo's College Musical for 2025

Last Monday Mr James Bell (Leader of CAPA) announced that the 2025 College Musical will be Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. The College has had a very strong tradition and background in producing professional and a very high standard of musicals.

Two recent students, Sam Harmon (HSC Class of 2018) - Lead roles in our previous productions of High School Musical, Guys and Dolls, Beauty and the Beast is understudy for Peter and Jesus in the upcoming production of Jesus Christ Superstar at Capital Theatre starting in
