Stage 3 Success with Project Firestorm

I am also pleased to announce that the instalment of sliding doors for Years 1 and 2 classrooms has been brought forward to this Friday. This will effectively mark the end of the building project with only minor items around the school needing attention.

PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS

I acknowledge and thank the entire school community parents, children and staff, for their patience and support during the last 11 months of the building program as well as the several months of discussion and planning leading up to the start of the refurbishment. It has been a very busy and sometimes challenging experience with condensed play spaces, relocating classrooms that required packing, moving and unpacking classrooms several times and dealing with interruptions and noise from the building works.

I also acknowledge and thank CSBB for their support of our school community in providing the means to achieve this remarkable result.

Change for Dismissal Procedures

As previously communicated via Compass, with the new synthetic grass area opened we have reinstated the previous (and usual) spaces for afternoon dismissal. Children will be gathering in the following spaces:

Walkers- on the silver seats outside Kindergarten Classrooms

Before and After School Care- Assembly Area (as normal)

Buses- Hall Veranda

Parent Pickup (including parents walking in and drive through pickup)- Grass area.

Parents who are walking into school to pickup will enter via the same double gates and then process in front of the school hall to the grass area to pickup children. Parents will then leave through the bottom single gate.

How can you help develop this at home?


Explain what 'active listening' is to your child, help them to understand its importance.


BOOK FAIR update
