Last year we launched our PBL (Positive Behaviours for Learning) system at St Patrick's. Starting back this year, we will be unpacking each of our values and what this looks like in our school. Children are becoming familiar with this language and know that by showing expected behaviours they can earn stamps, lucky tokens and then onto their Bronze, Silver or Gold Awards.

Our new library and maker space have excitedly welcomed the children back this year! We love having so much space and being able to read and learn in the different areas.


Please remind your children to bring their library bags on their assigned day so they can borrow one of our MANY new books.

eLibrary


