#### PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE

#### Dear Parents and Carers,

During our Ash Wednesday Mass we were reminded of the significance of the three pillars that help us journey to Easter: Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving. These pillars are not just traditions but essential practices that ground us in what is important and called to do in our lives.

Prayer is the cornerstone of our relationship with God. Through prayer, we open our hearts and minds to God's presence, seeking guidance, strength, and grace. During Lent, we are called to deepen our prayer life, setting aside dedicated time for conversation with God. Whether through traditional prayers, meditation, or contemplative silence, prayer allows us to align our will with God's and draw closer to Him.

Fasting, or self-denial, is a way to detach ourselves from worldly comforts. By voluntarily abstaining from certain things, we create space to focus on spiritual nourishment and dependence on God. Fasting reminds us of our reliance on God for sustenance and helps us cultivate self-discipline and self-control. Almsgiving, or acts of charity and generosity, reflect the love and compassion of Jesus. During Lent, we are called to reach out to those in need, sharing our blessings with others and embodying the spirit of solidarity and service. Almsgiving includes acts of kindness, forgiveness, and reconciliation. Through our generosity, we become instruments of God's love, bringing hope and healing to a broken world.

Each of these pillars—Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving—plays a vital role in our Lenten journey, guiding us towards spiritual renewal and deeper communion with God and one another. May this Lenten season be a time of profound spiritual growth and encounter with the living God.

#### St. Patrick's Day

St. Patrick's Feast Day will be celebrated in our parish on Sunday 16th March on the 2nd Sunday of Lent and then at school on Monday the 17th March.

During the school day we will have a host of activities throughout the day:

- The children can wear their school uniform with a touch of something green e.g., t-shirt, ribbon, or another accessory. Some items may be appropriate to wear after mass.
- Parents are welcome and encouraged to be on site and have some fun before school begins and I encourage parents to practice some handball or skipping to prepare for a fun morning.
- All classes will celebrate St. Patrick's Feast Day Mass together at 9:00am- parents are welcome to attend.
- Peer Support and Classroom-based activities during the day.

Here's a new puzzle to try this week!


The aim is for the whole family to collaborate on solving it.
