PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE

Dear Parents and Carers,

Yesterday, our school hosted two very successful School Open Day sessions with around 60 families taking the opportunity to tour our new facilities and find out why St. Patrick's is a great school. We received very positive feedback from those attending and I have already started to hold enrolment interviews for Kindergarten 2026.

A huge thank you to our Stage 3 leaders who conducted the tours with prospective parents and were most impressive in demonstrating in a practical way what it means to be a student here at St. Patrick's. It was wonderful to see these students speak with confidence and with pride about their school.

I also thank our wonderful parent volunteers and staff for their efforts to support the Open Day by volunteering their time on Thursday to meet new parents, express an authentic and positive view of the school, serve tea and coffee and thoroughly welcome our visitors to the school. It is this positive and generous sentiment that always impresses parents seeking a school for their child.

Enrolment for 2026

If parents are aware of families that have children ready to start school next year, I encourage you to recommend our school and the offer to come and find out more information. Prospective parents can contact the school to have a private tour and pick up an enrolment pack from the school office or enquire online via a link on our website.

The school initially requires up to 28 enrolments to create one class before a second class will be considered. Enrolments beyond that number will be placed on a waiting list until we have enough applications to make a second class.

I strongly encourage you to complete your enrolment form and return it to the school office as soon as possible, as this will help secure your child's place for kindergarten next year. I also encourage parents to tell you friends who have children starting school to consider St. Patrick's, as that could boost enrolments and secure a second kindergarten class.

St Patrick's Feast Day

The children enjoyed celebrating last Monday's St. Patrick's Feast Day by wearing a touch of green, getting involved with many fun activities throughout the day and learning about our Patron Saint- St. Patrick.

It was great to see our St. Patrick's Day Mass being well supported by our parent community. Fr. Joseph through his homily reminded the children of the special place St. Patrick has in the history of our church. As the Patron Saint of Ireland, he inspired and created an incredible legacy in that country but also around the world as Irish missionaries- priests, brothers and nuns, went many countries spreading the Good News of the Christian faith. It was St. Patrick's Faith, Courage and Determination that inspired many people to their faith.

Kindergarten- Open Classrooms

A reminder to all Kinder parents that on Wednesday 26th or Thursday 27th March, parents of Kindergarten students are invited to come to school and see the children in action in their class setting. Parents will be able to visit the classroom, meet and greet the teachers and generally get a feel of school life for your child.

We have chosen two afternoons to assist parents with some flexibility, and this will also mean the classrooms aren't too densely crowded with parents (to assist, please choose one or the other date rather than both). In the past, some grandparents have attended in place of parents due to parent work commitments. The chosen dates and schedule are below:

- 2:00pm: Meet in the hall for informal chat with Mr Vane-Tempest.
- 2.15pm: Parents go to their child's class, look at some of his/her work and chat to your child about "class life". Class teachers are available to informally chat to parents.
- 2.45pm: Parents can take their child home for the day.

Project Compassion

This Lent, we're invited to Unite Against Poverty with Caritas Australia's Project Compassion. This year is especially significant as we celebrate the Jubilee Year - a time of renewal and solidarity.

Project Compassion 2025 shares three stories from around the world. Students will meet Toefuata'iga - (Toy-foo-ah-tah-ing-ah) a young student from Samoa who faced severe water shortages at her school. Thanks to Caritas Australia and the generosity of supporters like you, her school now has a 10,000 L water tank improving hygiene and allowing the teachers to prioritise education.

We will also get to know Lam from Vietnam, born with short stature, Lam faced social exclusion and limited employment opportunities – through the I-SHINE program, Lam is now a freelance graphic designer.

And we'll meet Irene from the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) who faced immense challenges after losing her father to war and raising her children in poverty. With support from Caritas Australia, Irene received vocational training in sewing and farming and can now support her whole family.

Thank you for your support for Project Compassion. From our Pancake Day we have already raised \$210. Next week we will have a crazy hair/hat day with a donation to continue our support for Project Compassion.






PRC

Maths challenge Perimeter


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<u>Solution from last newsletter:</u> Bird order = blue, green, red, red This figure is made of squares.
